REPORT 2021 ANNUAL






Thanks to the support of our generous donors and partners, The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society of Canada (LLSC) continues to be a reliable source of information on COVID-19 and blood cancer, and more specifically on vaccine safety and efficacy. Over the past year, we developed Exercise Guidelines for youth going through a blood cancer, delivered webcasts on a variety of relevant topics, and continued to work on a new website to better serve people affected

by a blood cancer. Our newly formed Adolescent and Young Adult committee comprising of members with diverse blood cancer experiences across the country was instrumental in helping us understand their unmet needs and the resources that can help address some of the service gaps. Our art therapy service and virtual support groups made our community feel less alone in their blood cancer experience.

In 2022, we will continue to develop targeted resources and services to better support the needs of all those affected by a blood cancer, including underserved groups, such as young adults. An emphasis will be placed on using inclusive language when communicating with our community, providing information and resources, and we're looking forward to getting back to providing both in-person and virtual educational events to healthcare providers and people affected by cancer.

In 2022, LLSC will also relaunch its research program. Our strategy will be rooted in accelerating impact, addressing key unmet needs and engaging with the blood cancer community. This means, that we will invest in research projects that tackle challenges from bench to bedside, address unmet needs in the areas of pediatric blood cancers, survivorship and prevention, and we will engage with people affected by a blood cancer and their families to uncover emerging needs and opportunities.

Thank you to our incredible community, our partners and generous donors who have stepped up to show support for people affected by a blood cancer. Without you, none of what we do would ever be possible.







